At the May general meeting of the Centre **Allan Giroux** made the motion that the American flag be replaced by the Treaty 7 flag. The motion was approved by a vote of 4 to 3. The Treaty 7 flag represents the unity and heritage and ongoing significance of the first nations. The five first nations represented are the Siksika (Blackfoot), Kainai (Blood), Piikani (Peigan), Stoney-Nakoda and Tsuut'ina (Sarcee) peoples in southern Alberta. Treaty 7 is an agreement between the Crown and the aforementioned Indigenous Nations. It was signed on September 22, 1877 at Blackfoot Crossing now Fort Macleod.
