#### **SPRING CLEAN-UP**

Spring is here meaning it's time for the annual Spring Clean-Up!

Every Tuesday Public Works will pick up any acceptable listed items below. You may set items out on Monday but please be mindful that they will be collected on Tuesdays.

### **TOWN OFFICE & PUBLIC WORKS**

These items have a cost associated with them and will be added to your utility bill.

#### **Acceptable Items:**

Couches, love seats, mattresses, box spring, chairs, tables, and armchairs;

Dryer, washers, stoves, water tanks, refrigerators, freezers, a/c units, water coolers;

Wood items including fences and decks;

Metal and construction waste which is not heavier than 50lbs and no longer than 6ft;

Electronic waste including TVs, computers, computer monitors, keyboards, and associated cables.

#### **Unacceptable Items:**

Toxic waste, highly combustible items or explosive materials, biomedical waste, raw sewage or septic pumping and radioactive waste;

Hot ashes which are not properly quenched and appear hot likely to cause a fire;

Compressed propane or butane cylinders;

Toxic household hazardous waste including solvents, oven cleaner, paints, automotive fluids, wet cell batteries, pesticides, herbicides or any material commonly referred to as household, commercial or industrial hazardous waste;

Biomedical waste including needles or syringes, lancets or any sharp items used in home medical care; Dead animals or animal parts from hunting or trapping;

Radioactive waste.

The Town is installing flashing crosswalk indicators on 55th Ave due to increased traffic. Once installed we encourage all residents (including children) to utilize this safety feature.


### **LAGOON MAP**

#### Drop-Off Compost Pile—

Residents are allowed to drop off any compost items

#### Pick-up Compost Pile—

Public works breaks down the dropped off compost pile & restacks same here



Tree Chipping—Wood chippings

Large Tree Branches—Anyone can use this wood as firewood, NO FENCES OR DECKS, branches ONLY

Sand Pile—Repurposed sand from Public Works and/or Ag Society

Burn Pit—Tree Branches 4 inches or less, Public Works burns 2-3 times a year

**Dirt Pile**—Repurposed dirt, be mindful of how much you take, this is for everyone

Cement Pile—Old cement

Anyone may contribute and/or take from the piles at the lagoon. Gravel can be purchased at a fee of \$30 per backhoe bucket.

## **Spring Cleanup & Burning**

As spring arrives and cleaning begins including outdoor burning, we encourage you to follow these tips:

- Clear debris: Remove leaves, branches, and other dry vegetation that can easily ignite.
- **Safe burning:** If burning is permitted, ensure same is in a safe, clear location. It is important to have water and fire extinguishers readily available.
- Check equipment: Ensure gas BBQs and other outdoor equipment are in good working order and free of debris.

#### **Wildfire Preparedness**

The importance of being prepared for wildfires is always a concern, here are some tips when preparing:

- **Create a defensible space:** Clear vegetation around homes & buildings to reduce the risk of wildfire spread.
- **Develop an evacuation plan:** Know where and how to get to your destination in case of a wildfire.
- Stay informed: Monitor weather conditions and wildfire alerts from local authorities.
