LANDSCAPING MANAGEMENT

Property owners must maintain all vegetation on their land, including keeping woody growth at least one foot clear of sidewalks.

Under Bylaw #888, if this is not done, the Town may issue a notice giving 21 days to comply, followed by a final 7-day notice. If the issue remains, the Town will complete the work and add the cost to the property taxes.
