FEBRUARY FIRE SAFETY REMINDER

Stavelly Fire Department

February is one of the peak months for home fires due to increased use of heating equipment, fireplaces, and electrical devices. A few simple precautions can significantly reduce the risk of fire in your home.

Heating & Fireplace Safety

- Keep space heaters at least 3 feet (1 metre) away from curtains, furniture, and bedding
 - Turn off heaters when leaving a room or going to bed
 - Have chimneys inspected and cleaned annually
 - Use a metal screen on fireplaces to catch sparks
 - Never use an oven or stovetop to heat your home
- Maintain a 3-foot "kid-free" zone around heaters and fireplaces



Electrical, Candles & Generators

- Avoid overloading outlets, power strips, and extension cords
- Never run portable generators or gas-powered equipment indoors or in garages
 - Use LED candles when possible
- If using real candles, keep them 12 inches from anything flammable and never leave them unattended



Essential Fire Safety

- Test smoke alarms monthly
- Create a home escape plan with two exits from every room
 - Keep a working fire extinguisher accessible
- Never leave cooking unattended; keep a lid nearby to smother pan fires

Taking a few minutes to review these safety tips can help protect your home and family. The Stavelly Fire Department encourages everyone to stay fire-safe this winter
