TRANSITION TO GARBAGE BINS

The Town of Stavelly and Public Works are excited to announce the move from manual garbage collection to **automated bin pickup!**

What This Means for Residents

- Each household will receive one bin, matched to your civic address. The Town is providing your first bin at no cost. Care for it responsibly—replacement bins will be available for a fee.
- **Pickup will now be from the curb in front of your house, on your main street. Garbage will no longer be collected from alleys.**
- Collection day remains Monday.
- Utility fees will not change.
- If you absolutely need a second bin the Town can accommodate same—although an extra fee will be added to your utilities monthly.
- An information sheet will be attached inside your bin lid upon delivery for easy reference.

Bin Roll-Out Schedule

- **Phase 1 (Oct. 7–10 delivery | First pickup Oct. 14):** Harvest Hills, Butte Place, Canyon Court, Coulee Trail, Park Crescent & Young Crescent.
- **Phase 2 (Nov. 4–7 delivery | First pickup Nov. 10):** All remaining areas of town.

This phased approach gives Public Works time to fine-tune the process and ensure a smooth transition.

Important Reminder

Our new garbage truck uses a **compaction system**, which means certain items **must never** go in your regular garbage. Items such as propane tanks, lithium batteries, butane cylinders, or anything highly combustible or explosive that could cause fires or even explosions inside the truck.

These items can be safely disposed of during the Town's **Spring & Fall Clean-Up events**, where Public Works will collect them for you.

This year's theme, "*Charge into Fire Safety™: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home*," highlights safe use, charging, and disposal of lithium-ion batteries found in phones, laptops, tools, toys, and more. Improper use can cause overheating, fires, or explosions.

Key Safety Tips:

- **BUY safely:** Choose products with a recognized testing lab mark to ensure safety standards. Avoid unsafe or unlisted products.
- **CHARGE properly:** Use manufacturer-approved chargers, follow instructions, charge on hard surfaces, and unplug when fully charged.
- **DISPOSE responsibly:** Never toss batteries in the trash. Recycle at approved battery recycling locations.

FALL CLEAN-UP

Fall Clean-Up is here! Please set out acceptable items in neat piles on the curb so our Public Works Department can collect them without entering private property. Please review the **Garbage Bylaw #871 Section 16** for more information on our website. Fees will be charged per item collected.

Acceptable items include:

Couches, love seats, mattresses, box springs, chairs, tables, and armchairs ;

Dryers, washers, stoves, water tanks, refrigerators, freezers, a/c units, water coolers;

Wood items including fences and decks;

Metal and construction waste which is no heavier than 50lbs no longer than 6ft;

Electronic waste, including televisions, computers, computer monitors, keyboards, and associated cables.
